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




#### **Recognizing Innovative Product Design for Learning Environments**


EDspaces has partnered with Learning By Design Magazine to present the 2021 Product Innovation Awards.



The objective was to create sustainable and energy efficient building material standards, and 21st-century classroom and furniture design standards. In 2017, the district passed a \$100.9 million referendum with specific funds allocated to furniture. The unique partnerships, standards manual, and pilot classrooms lay the groundwork for successful project outcomes.


